Jeannine graduated from NIACC in 1980 and was very proud of her degree. Jeannine taught at Mason City Community School District for five years. She

was also a Girl Scout Leader and Church Youth Leader. In her free time she enjoyed reading historical fiction and loved going to the Clear Lake Public Library. She loved history and collecting antiques, which filled their home. Jeannine was very social and involved in many card groups and golfing groups; although her favorite card game UNO was played with her grandchildren.
