Julius C. Harig, 68, of Rockwell, Iowa died at home.

Funeral services will be held at 10:30 am Tuesday, November 25, 2014 at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, 305 Elm St. E, Rockwell. Officiating will be the Rev. Rod Allers. Commensurate with Julius's wishes he would like relatives and friends to congregate at the Rockwell American Legion from 5 to 7:00 pm Monday. A wake service will be held at 5:30 pm. Interment will be 2:00 pm, Tuesday at the Calvary Cemetery in Algona where his cremated remains will be laid to rest next to his parents. Graveside rites will be conducted by Deacon Bill Black. Julius was born in Algona, Iowa the son of Raymond and Dorothy Harig. He was the only boy of three children. He graduated from Bishop Garrigan High School in 1964. He enlisted in the Navy in 1965 and served three sea duty tours and was honorable discharged in 1971. He loved where he lived in the country, along with his dog Gunner, cat Molly, chickens, and tending his gardens full of fruits and vegetables. Julius was a gentle giant of a man and treated his friends and family and garnered respect from others due to his nature. He was a bit gruff on the outside but was a teddy bear on the inside. He was infatuated with cars and being in the outdoors and especially taking road trips on his customized Harley. For his work he was a union pipefitter

until his retirement and was instrumental in some of the design work for the new Alliant Energy plant that he helped bring to fruition, South of Mason City. He was employed for many years for North Central Construction and held his last position with Industrial Piping Services.

Those surviving Julius include his son Nolan, W. Harig of Algona, two sisters Merle (Gary) Norcross, Nevada, MO; and Mary (Jim) MacLeod of Lees Summit, MO, and several nieces and nephews.

His parents preceded him in death.
