Larry J. Schultz, 65, of Panora, died Wednesday, January 28, 2015 at Bay Area Hospital in Corpus Christi, Texas.

Larry was born in Charles City the son of Albert and LaVon Schultz. He eventually became one of eight siblings. He graduated from Rudd-Rockford-Marble Rock schools. He then graduated from Northwest Vocational School in Sheldon, Iowa as a power lineman. For the next 44 years he worked as a power lineman for Butler County REC, spending 30 years in the field and the remaining 14 as a member service representative and marketing director, retiring in September of 2013. Larry was united in marriage to Sandra DeNoble on November 29, 1968 in George, Iowa. To this union was born two sons, Lance and Lorin Schultz. After 25 years they parted, but remained

friends. Larry enjoyed doing carpentry on the side, working on houses, improving and selling them and helping his boys with various projects. He had a great joy working and being in the outdoors. He was a bow/black powder deer hunter and was most avid about his fishing trips. He enjoyed annual trips to Canada with his sons, friends, and his brothers, as well as taking his boys Salmon and Walleye fishing to Lake Michigan, Mille Lacs, and Baudette. In his younger years he sang with his church group and traveled to area churches to perform with others. He still came home and would share with guitar and song with his family. He attended many sporting events with this family which included watching his son coach wrestling, the granddaughter's softball/volleyball games, and the grandson's football games. After retirement, Larry moved from Waverly, IA to Panora, IA to be closer to his boys and grandchildren.

He was actually the first friend I made here. At the time Larry was 'moonlighting' as a bar tender at the Risky Business lounge in Waverly. After a crazy day at work, Jean and I stopped by to blow off some steam and met Larry. Soon, Monday nights at 7:30pm we would go visit Larry at the bar. He later remodeled our basement and lived there for about a year. Larry introduced us to fishing and enjoying the Cedar River. He was such a hard worker... and so self sufficient. Larry could build, fix or do about anything. He could sell an ice box to an Eskimo! He would come over with his guitar and sing a song about Johnny and electrical safety to the delight of my young boys. I could call him anytime of day to get his take on different projects we were working on and he always had such valuable insight.

On of my favorite memories of Larry was in 1996. Larry was living in our basement at the time and Ragbrai was coming through Waverly past the house. Larry set up a food stand selling maidrites, chips and soda. It was a very hot afternoon. After a few or more beers Larry picked up his guitar and started singing to the joy of 28 cyclists staying at our house. He left a 'put your money in the coffee can' sign by his food booth and came inside to provide entertainment. When he got up the next day, the crock pot was still plugged in with burnt on food ect and there was the coffee can full of cash. He nearly sold out of food at his un-maned booth.
