



## William "Bill" F Butler

April 10, 1926 - August 30, 2019

William "Bill" F. Butler, 93, formerly of Charles City and longtime businessman at Butler Men's Wear, died Friday, August 30, 2019 at Nation's Cottage in Cedar Falls.

Funeral Services will be held at 11:00 am, Thursday, September 5, 2019 at Fullerton Funeral Home 401 Blunt, Charles City. Deacon Mike Ward of Immaculate Conception Catholic Church will officiate. William Francis Butler was born on April 10, 1926 in Williams, Iowa the son of Harry and Bernadine (Doyle) Butler. He graduated from high school and then served in the Navy as a Sonar Specialist. He was honorably discharged. He served as an orderly at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, MN. He later worked for Leuthold Brothers in LaVerne, MN where he met the love of his life, Bernice Piper. Bill was united in marriage to Bernice on June 28, 1948 in LaVerne and began their adventures together for almost 50 years before Bernie's death on March 30, 1998. To this union was born two daughters Jill and Jean. They moved to Charles City in 1952 where Bill opened and operated a men's clothing store that was eventually known as Butler's Men's Wear.
